# Austin Public Health Relief in a State of Emergency (RISE) Fund





#### RISE Fund

- April 9, 2020 Resolution
- \$15M to provide immediate direct services and assistance.
- Relief to:
  - Lower income and vulnerable
  - Ineligible for other forms of assistance
  - Other forms of assistance not sufficient or timely to meet basic needs

#### Populations and Providers

- Priority Populations
  - Communities of color
  - LGBTQI+
  - Survivors of Domestic Violence
  - Other historically marginalized

- Immigrants
- Seniors

 Service Providers that demonstrate trust and success reaching priority populations

#### **Fund Distribution**

- Direct Relief Services half \$7.5M
  - Food Access
  - Rent/mortgage Assistance
  - Diapers, baby formula, child care
  - Other services to meet basic needs

- Necessary expenses utilities
- Medical expenses
- Case Management

- Direct Financial Assistance half \$7.5M
  - Legally allowable transfers or one-time payments (pre-paid debt or credit)
  - Existing framework established by APH to properly account for funds

#### **Application Evaluation**

- Applications evaluated and scored.
- Considerations given to agencies:
  - who have experience administering direct assistance to clients
  - who currently serve one or more priority populations
  - with the capacity to start the administration of the funds immediately and efficiently
  - that demonstrate they will provide funds with an equity focus

## Client Eligibility

- Directly impacted by COVID-19
- Priority populations
- Low-Income, at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Residents of Austin/ Travis County
- Other forms of assistance are insufficient or not timely
- Ineligible for CARES' Economic Impact Payment (per IRS guidelines)
